**GENERAL ORDER**  
NO. 01-11

This order amends General Order No. 99-6.

Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2518(8)(a),

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

(1) Except as otherwise directed by the issuing judge, the recordings of the contents of any wire, oral, or electronic communication recorded under the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 2518 shall, immediately upon the expiration of the period of the interception order, or extensions thereof, be made available to the issuing judge and sealed pursuant to this general order;


(2) The recordings may be delivered to the Clerk of the United States District Court, or his or her designee. The Clerk's designee shall include the Chief Deputy Clerk, the Deputy in Charge, the Courtroom Deputy Supervisor, or the Docketing Supervisor. Thereafter, custody of the recording shall be maintained by the Clerk of the United States District Court, or his or her designee. In the presence of the issuing judge, the Clerk of Court, or his or her designee shall seal the recordings by placing them in a box and sealing the box with tape or other sealant. The issuing judge, the Clerk of the Court, or his or her designee, shall place his or her initials on the box or

boxes that are sealed together with the date that the boxes were sealed and the approximate time of sealing;

(3) While in the custody of the Clerk of the Court, the recordings shall be kept in a secure facility in such a manner as to protect the recordings from editing or other alterations.
