It has been determined by the Archivist of the United States and concurred in by the Administrative Office of the United States Courts that certain records of the District Courts, as well as the old Territorial Court and Circuit Court records, have sufficient historical and other value to warrant their continued preservation among the National Archives of the United States. It has also been determined that such records will be maintained in the Federal Records Center where presently deposited but will be accessioned from the Federal Records Center to the Regional Archives. It is, therefore,
