WARNING ABOUT NEW JURY “eJuror” SCAM

Several U.S. district courts reported on Wednesday, July 30, that citizens in their districts are being targeted by a juror phishing e-mail that asks recipients to provide personal identifiers (SSN, DOB, mother’s maiden name, etc.) on an attached PDF form and then e-mail the completed form back to the originator. This scam differs from previous jury scams because it uses "eJuror" as the source of the e-mail and attempts to obtain personal identifiers by return e-mail.

The U.S. District Court for the District of Nebraska does use an online jury application called “eJuror.” It allows prospective jurors to complete the required qualifying questionnaire online, safely and securely.

But before members of the public can complete the eJuror questionnaire online, they must be authenticated as prospective jurors for our court. The instructions on how to do this will come in formal written correspondence that prospective jurors receive directly from the court via the U.S. mail. **The court will never initially contact prospective jurors by e-mail, nor will it request prospective jurors to send personal identification information in a return e-mail.**
