GENERAL ORDER NO. 2026-01

This matter having come before the Court on the application by the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Nebraska for an Order authorizing the United States Federal Air Marshal Service (FAMS) to issue citations for violations of certain sections of the United States Code, and for good cause appearing therefore:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that FAMS is now authorized to issue citations or violation notices to any person whom they have probable cause to believe is guilty of violations of the specifically enumerated offenses set forth in Exhibit A.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the proposed fine schedule for the enumerated offenses is approved by the Court as set forth in Exhibit A.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that FAMS may use the location code designated by the Central Violations Bureau (CVB) for the District of Nebraska, with respect to violations of the enumerated offenses as set forth in Exhibit A that occur in the District of Nebraska.



Service, is adopted and incorporated into the collateral forfeiture schedules for the CVB as set forth in the attached Schedules A through J, effective May 19, 2026.

WILDLIFE/PROPERTY FORFEITURE ORDER

Unless otherwise specifically ordered by a United State Court, any wildlife or property which has been seized under the authority of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, 16 USC 703-711; the National Wildlife Refuge Systems Administrative Act, 16 USC 721-731; The Eagle Protection Act, 16 USC 668-668e; The Endangered Species Act, 16 USC 1531-1542; The Migratory Waterfowl Hunting Stamp Act, 16 USC 718-718i; The Airborne Hunting Act, 16 USC 742j-1; The Marine Mammal Protection Act, 16 USC 1361-1407; The Tariff Classification Act, 19 USC 1202; The Lacey Act, 18 USC 42, The Lacey Act Amendments, 16 USC 3371-3378; The American Antiquities Act, 16 USC 433; The African Elephant Conservation Act, 16 USC 4201-4245, The Archeological Resources Protection Act, 16 USC 470aa et seq.; and The Wild Bird Conservation Act, 16 USC 4901-4916, where in the final disposition of the case has been made by either payment of a forfeiture of collateral or a judgement by the Court on behalf of the government and where so authorized by statute, such wildlife or property shall be forfeited to the U.S. Government and disposed of by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in the manner prescribed by Title 50, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 12.

MANDATORY COURT APPEARANCES OR ARRESTS

Recognizing the concern of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, the U.S. Attorney's Office and the various other state and federal wildlife agencies regarding recidivists and aggravated offenses, it

is herein provided that if circumstances warrant, the law enforcement officer will contact the U.S. Attorney's Office and request a mandatory court appearance before the appropriate U.S. Magistrate Judge. Certain violations are herein already described as a mandatory appearance violation because of the serious nature of the offense. Nothing herein shall prohibit the law enforcement officer from arresting a person for the commission of any offense including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited and taking said person immediately before a United States Magistrate Judge if so warranted.
